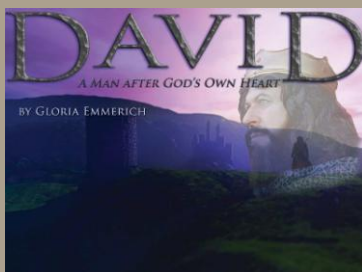
David

LifeQuest, Inc. is a Psychosocial Rehabilitation Program for adults with severe and persistent mental illness. Our mission is to help adults achieve the self-empowerment needed to enable them to live a successful, rewarding life. LifeQuest, Inc. is licensed by the State of North Carolina Division of Health and Human Services and is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF).

LifeQuest, Inc. opened on July 1, 2004 with four members and two employees. Today, we have forty members and eight employees. Our members come from various areas of the community. Many reside in group homes, some live with their families, and a few live independently.



At LifeQuest, Inc., we provide a structured environment which offers assistance in areas such as social/interpersonal skills, money management, time management, anger management, independent living skills, character building skills, and vocational skills. Assistance with skills is offered through class and instructional time, group activities, role playing, self-help videos, leadership opportunities within the various units, community integration, and a work program that incorporates our on-site clothing store and snack shop.

Our members strive daily to increase their skills that will enable them to live independently. Some of our former members have moved into independent living settings. Those who continue to work toward independence are making gains by participating in our contract labor program. Since we share the building we are located in with other businesses, opportunities within the building exist, making our location a great asset for LifeQuest members.



The Rocky Hock Playhouse has offered opportunities for our members in ushering and distributing playbills. This helps our members develop social/interpersonal skills through interactions with the patrons. The theatre has also offered an opportunity for the Arts and Crafts Unit to open and operate a Craft Store during the productions. Our members are responsible for making crafts, setting up the store, greeting customers, and operating the cash register.



Mrs. Cromley's Country Buffet Restaurant has given several members the opportunity to learn vocational skills by working in the kitchen when the restaurant is open for theatre patrons. Those members are chosen from the contract labor team and possess self-motivation and initiative in completing demanding tasks such as washing dishes, and preparing vegetables, meats, and desserts.



LifeQuest members are also involved with other community agencies. The Beautification Unit is currently working on a project called "Blankets of Hope" in which the members make blankets that will be placed in the City of Washington police cars. This is being done as a way to help and give comfort and warmth to accident victims. The members have worked with Walmart by having some of the materials donated for the project.

LifeQuest is also organizing a Mental Health/Craft Fair to be held in June. Various agencies from the area will be participating as vendors to promote their services and provide crafts they have made. Proceeds from the fair will benefit the "Blankets of Hope" project.
